THE EDITORS DESK

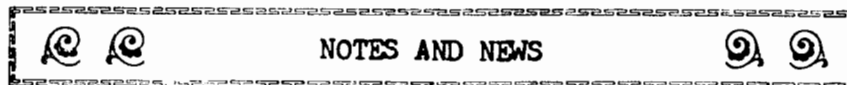

This entire Missouri Upshaw line originates with Drury Upshaw, who was born about 1786, as is seen from various data throughout this issue.

This issue concludes from September, December and June issues of The Ozark Quarterly the sketches which were published in two volumes as Fireside Stories of the Early Days in the Ozarks about 1900-1910. The information was obtained by Mr. Turnbo in personal interviews with old-timers. Only the genealogical data is reproduced here. (A genealogical condensation of the sketch, "A Few Incidents of a Peculiar Nature, in the Line of Hunting and Otherwise" by S. C. Turnbo).

Mr. Drury Upshaw was born on Fox Creek, a tributary stream of Bryant's Fork of Big North Fork, in 1848. Drury is a son of Tervey and Tiddie (Warren) Upshaw. His father is buried in the Upshaw Graveyard on Brush Creek, another stream of Bryant's Fork; his mother is buried in the Wood's Graveyard on Fox Creek.

Notes from Funeral Home records in Erath County, Texas:

John Hughes, born 4 April 1867, died 12 October 1921; father, W. P. Hughes, mother, Sarah Upshaw, born in Missouri.

Hughes Family Addition:

"In case you are interested, I can add a little information to the Hughes family mentioned in the May 1974 issue on p. 25. W. P. Hughes (William or Will) was born in 1838 in Ky., the son of Joseph Hughes b 13 Aug 1798 Ky, d 22 Jan 1876 Graves Co Ky, and Rhoda Riggs b 2 Mar 1798 Ky, d 7 Sept 1875. Both Joseph and Rhoda Riggs Hughes are buried in Bayou de Chine Cemetery in Graves Co Ky. W.P. Hughes married Sarah M. Upshaw 4 Mar 1861 in Obion Co, Tenn. (Marriage Book D). My husband is a descendant of W. P. Hughes' sister, Martha Frances Hughes, who married Samuel Rhodam Seay."

The Name "Upshaw"

Lenora Higginbotham Sweeney, in her sketch of "The Upshaw Family of Essex", relates the following: "The name Upshaw may possibly have been derived from the hamlet of Upshire in the Parish of Waltham, County of Essex, England."

Bishop Meade, "Old Churches, and Ministers and Families of Virginia", (Vol. 2; p. 429) mentions the Upshaw family as one of the leading families in eastern Virginia in Colonial times and after the Revolution.

We have found branches of the progenitor William Upshaw, living in Essex, Amherst and Buckingham Counties, Virginia. One son LeRoy, migrated to Elbert County, Georgia and was living there in 1791. It is likely that Drury Upshaw, who was the progenitor of the Douglas County, Missouri, Upshaws, spent some time in Georgia, as census records reveal one child born in Georgia. The old Greene County History (1883) (p. 896), states that Drury Upshaw settled on a place called "Upshur Prairie" in 1830 on a section of land which now lies in Webster County, Missouri. According to Census records we find Drury's eldest child born in North Carolina,* several born in Tennessee, one in Georgia and one in Illinois. Family names tie in with the old Upshaw family of Virginia. For further light on the early Upshaw lines we recommend study of Sweeney's Sketch found in William and Mary Historical Magazine, (Vol. 18; pages 64 to 109).

Key to the Numbering
of the
UPSHAW FAMILY

In numbering the following persons in the lineage, we have given the first one - DRURY UPSHAW - the number 100. His children, or the second generation, begins with the number 200. The third generation, or his grand-children, begin with the number 300; the fourth generation, 400 and so forth. Thus the reader may trace back to the common ancestor and know by the number preceding the name of each, to which generation the individual belongs.

Please note that, beginning with the sixth generation, we have assigned a four-digit number, due to the large number of descendants in the sixth, seventh, and eighth generations.

- 100 - DRURY 1 UPSHAW (the first); born 1767 in South Carolina or Virginia.
- 200 - DRURY 2 UPSHAW (son of Drury 1); born in Virginia 1787; married FRANKIE PARNUE.
- 300 - CYNTHIA UPSHAW (daughter of DRURY 2) who married first, DAVIS FIELDS; married second, WILLIAM GARNER. (No children).
- 301 - (Capt.) JOHN SEVIER UPSHAW, married JANE WOODS.
- 302 - REBECCA ELIZABETH UPSHAW, married JAMES WOODS.
- 303 - WILLIAM UPSHAW (Drury 2), married NICEY WESTON? or SWEETEN?
- 304 - ESSEL UPSHAW (Drury 2), married ELISETT (Gussie) McKEY.
- 305 - LEROY UPSHAW (Drury 2), married LYDIA PARSONS.
- (305) - LYDIA (PARSONS) UPSHAW; married second WILLIAM ALSUP.
- 306 - DAVID UPSHAW (Drury 2), married GINSEY _____.
- 307 - POLLY UPSHAW (Drury 2), married first, JAMES PATTON; married second, BEN PERKINS.

UPSHAW

Descendants of DRURY UPSHAW. All of the following lineage has been worked from the information given in "A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region", pages 757-758, by Goodspeed Brothers of Chicago; published in 1894. Also from information obtained from Mrs. Viola Farmer Upshaw of Mountain Grove, Mo.; Census Records; Tombstone Inscriptions and family records.

100 - DRURY UPSHAW (1); born 1767 in South Carolina or Virginia. We have no further information for him, except that he had a son. (See Notes 1, 2, 3.)

1 Letter dated 29 Aug 1974 from Mrs. Grace E. Jared to Ted O. Brooke: "In will of William Upshaw (son of Jeremiah, son of William & Hannah), who was the first husband of Elizabeth Hunt, he stated she would be disinherited if she re-married."

Letter dated 9 Aug 1974 from Mrs. Grace E. Jared to Ted O. Brooke: "It's very possible that Elizabeth, widow of William Upshaw, lived with Drury Christian without marrying, because in his will her first husband disinherited her if she re-married and, as the children were called Upshaw - some one is descended from them, but not true Upshaws; illustration - the Drury Upshaw line in Missouri."

Letter dated 20 Oct 1947 from Mrs. Bessie Selleck to Mrs. Grace E. Jared: "We have about decided that Elizabeth Upshaw in Wm. & Mary Quarterly, Vol. 18 No. 1, Jan. 1938 (widow of William Upshaw and later companion of Drury Christian) is the one which had our line (Drury Upshaw of Missouri); however, something else may develop."

Letter dated 29 Aug 1974 from Mrs. Grace E. Jared to Ted O. Brooke: "Mrs. Selleck was a good genealogist and writer. She thought Drury Christian's and Elizabeth (Hunt) Upshaw's four children were illegitimate, and not true Upshaws."

Editor's note: Referring to Christian Family notes in UFJ, Vol. IV pages 12-35 and, in particular, to Editor's comments appearing on pages 16 and 17 of that issue: Drury Christian, in his will, 1783 Amherst Co., Va., does name his four children as John Christian Upshaw, Elizabeth Christian Upshaw, Lucy Christian Upshaw, and Sally Christian Upshaw; however, he had no son named Drury and his only son, John, used the name John Christian when he became of age. (See Amherst Co., Va. Deed Book M, pages 322, 323.) There is no record of a Drury Upshaw who was born circa 1767; the Drury Upshaw of 1810 Pendleton Dist., S.C., 1830 Madison Co., Ill., and 1840 Taney Co., Mo., was born between 1780 and 1790, which is of the proper age to have been a son of Leroy (RS) and Elizabeth (Bradley) Upshaw, and there is proof that Forrester Upshaw, who would have been his older brother, was in Pendleton 1805/1806.

The past conjecture of an illegitimate Drury Upshaw, born 1767, as the progenitor of this Missouri line is totally unsupported by record or circumstance and has no substance in fact. The recorded facts in Amherst County and elsewhere simply prove that there is no such person as Drury Upshaw (#100), born 1767.

2 Letter dated 23 Oct 1946 from Mrs. Bessie Selleck to Mrs. Grace E. Jared: "I asked Henry Upshaw (#507) of Douglas County ... who said that John Sevier Upshaw (#301), eldest son of Drury Upshaw (#200) gave the biography to the compilers of "A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region"; Mrs. Selleck then comments that "He (John Sevier Upshaw) seems to have been wrong about a few things ... 1812 War Service (of Drury) for instance; and his grandfather's name being Drury - he could have been mistaken about that, too."

- 200 - DRURY UPSHAW (2); born 1787 in Virginia (1880 census); died 1846 in Douglas County, Missouri, and is buried in the Denlow Cemetery in the southeast corner, next to his wife. There is no monument but a stone wall around both graves. (See Note 4.) He married FRANKIE PARNUE. (There is some doubt about the spelling of her last name. It could be "Parmele" or "Parmely".) She was born in 1790 in North Carolina (Census record) and died 1861 in Crawford County, Missouri. Her son, John Sevier Upshaw, brought her body back to Douglas County and buried it beside that of his father. In the 1860 census returns of Falling Springs, FRANKIE is listed as "FRANCIS" living with John Sevier and Jane Upshaw. (See Note 5.) The children of DRURY 2 and FRANKIE were:
- 300 - CYNTHIA UPSHAW, born 1810 in South Carolina; died about 1860; buried in the southeast corner of Denlow Cemetery. No marker at the head of her grave, just a huge rock. She married first, DAVIS FIELDS. He is buried in Denlow beside Cynthia.
Cynthia (Upshaw) Fields married second, WILLIAM GARNER. There were no children.
- 301 - (Captain) JOHN SEVIER UPSHAW, born May 28, 1813 in Tennessee; died Jan. 20, 1911; buried in Denlow Cemetery in the southeast corner. He was a Captain of the Home Guards of Douglas County during the Civil War. He was pensioned on 22 Jan. 1903 by a special act of Congress. There is a marker at his grave. He married, in Springfield, Mo., in 1833, JANE WOODS (daughter of Isaac Woods of Greene County, Mo., who settled in Springfield in 1831. Isaac Woods was in the War of 1812 and is found in Giles Co., Tenn.)

3 Letter dated 11 Nov. 1946 from Mrs. Bessie Selleck to Mrs. Grace E. Jared: "Drury's son, John Sevier Upshaw, gave all that biography by memory, which is in "A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region", and I do not believe it is accurate. Somehow I do not believe they came to Webster County in 1829; I think it was around 1830 or 1831, as Martha was born in Illinois in 1832, according to Census records. He says several things which contradict."

4 Letter dated 3 Dec. 1945 from Mrs. Edith Mae Pulliam to Mrs. Grace E. Jared: "I honestly have felt all along that Leroy is the father of Drury II. The name Leroy follows, as you can see, all the way through my line. The history that was given of Drury ("A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region") could be wrong. You know how they were in those days. To date I have the following information about Drury II, b. 1787, who married Frankie or Francis -

- 1810 - He was in S.C., because Cynthia was born there.
- 1813 - He was in Tenn., as John Sevier was born there.
- 1816 - He was in Tenn., as Rebecca Elizabeth was born there.
- 1818 - He was in Ga., as William was born there.
- 1820 - He was in Ga., as Essell was born there.
- 1827 - He was in Tenn., as Leroy was born there.
- 1830 - He was in Tenn., as Davis was born there.
- 1832 - He was in Ill., as Martha was born there. (Mother thinks she was born on the way to Mo., as there is a route which came through Ill.)"

5 Letter dated 23 Oct 1946 from Mrs. Bessie Selleck to Mrs. Grace E. Jared: "I asked Henry Upshaw (#507) of Douglas Co. ... why Francis, Drury Upshaw's (#200) widow was at Cuba, Missouri, where she died. Her son William (#303) was working there on the railroad near Cuba, had been ill, and she went up there to take care of him. John Sevier Upshaw (#301), one of her sons, moved her body to Douglas County some 10 years after her death."

- She was born in 1814 in Tennessee; died 1897, and is buried in Denlow Cemetery by the side of her husband. There is no marker. (See Note 6.)
- 302 - REBECCA ELIZABETH UPSHAW (Drury 2, 1); born 1816 in Tennessee, married JAMES WOODS of Greene County. (See Note 7.)
- 303 - WILLIAM UPSHAW (Drury 2, 1), born 1818, in Georgia. (The sketch in "A Reminiscent History of the Ozark Region" says he died in 1849. This is incorrect, as he is listed in the 1850 Census Records. He married NICEY WESTON? or SWEETON? in Crawford County, Missouri. (See Note 8.) She was born in Illinois in 1829. Their children were:
- 409 - MARY ANN UPSHAW, born 1845 in Missouri.
- 410 - LAFAYETTE UPSHAW, born 1847 or 1848 in Missouri; married HARRIETTE TETRICK, born 1845 in Indiana (census), and they had:
- 500 - JOHN M. UPSHAW, born 1875; married PEARL HINKLE and had:
- 6000 - OTIS UPSHAW, died in Oklahoma.
- 6001 - NORMAN UPSHAW, lives in Oklahoma.
- 6002 - ALTA UPSHAW, lives in Texas.
- 6003 - GOLDA UPSHAW, single and lives in Douglas County.
- 6004 - JIM UPSHAW, lives in Mt. Grove, Mo.
- 6005 - ARTHUR UPSHAW
- 6006 - MCKINLEY UPSHAW
- 6007 - RAY UPSHAW
- 6008 - CARL UPSHAW
- All these children were reared in the Evans community in Douglas County.
- 501 - WILLIAM THOMAS UPSHAW, born 1873; married PEARL FOSTER, Oct. 7, 1900 and they had:
- 6009 - FLOYD UPSHAW
- 6010 - FAYETTE UPSHAW
- 6011 - STELLA UPSHAW, who married _____ RILEY and lives in Chanute, Kansas.
- 502 - LAURA UPSHAW, married JOHN MILSAP. (Census gives her birth year as 1868.)

6 Letter dated 11 Nov 1946 from Mrs. Bessie Selleck to Mrs. Grace E. Jared:
 "I know that in 1833 when John Sevier Upshaw married my aunt they went to St. Louis and lived for awhile before going down into Douglas County."

7 Letter dated 3 Dec 1945 from Mrs. Edith Mae Pulliam to Mrs. Grace E. Jared:
 "302 - Rebecca Elizabeth Upshaw (Drury 2, 1); born 1816, died 1865, buried in Denlow Cemetery. Married James Woods of Greene Co., Mo. (son of Dr. Isaac Jackson Woods), brother of Jane Woods; b. 1816; d. 1864 or '65. Issue:
 404 - John Sevier Woods II, b. 1843 in Mo.; d. Apr. 20, 1905; md. Louisa Sluder, 1849 in Mo.
 405 - Isaac Jackson Woods III, b. 1845 in Mo.; d. Jan. 5, 1877, buried Woods Homestead; md. Margaret McMillen, b. 1843 in Texas; d. Mar. 9, 1930.
 406 - Essell Woods, b. 1848 in Mo.; md. Mandy Starks.
 407 - Greene C. Woods, b. 1852 in Mo.; d. Dec. 7, 1915. md. Nancy Walker."

My great-grandmother, Frances Evelyn Upshaw (#419 in Drury Upshaw of Virginia) married Neil Dotson, son of Eric Dotson. Eric was born in Lund, Sweden; his wife, Ilga _____, was also born in Sweden. While living in Missouri, the name was changed to Dodson. Great-uncle John Dodson's death certificate gives his father's name as William Neil Dodson, born in Tenn. Frances married (2) Bill Miller.

DRURY UPSHAW (deceased). Among the early pioneers of Douglas County, Mo., stands the name of Drury Upshaw, whose advent into this county dated from the year 1838. Earnestly and zealously he labored to subdue the wilderness and by persistent effort gathered around him many of the comforts and conveniences of life. He was a native of Tennessee and a son of Drury Upshaw, who was also a native of that State, and who passed his entire life there. In his native State our subject was married to Miss Frankie Parnue, a native of North Carolina. In 1812 he served in the war, and as before stated, came to this county in 1838, and took up Government land. His death occurred in 1846 and his widow followed him to the grave in 1861, her death occurring in Crawford County. Mr. Upshaw was at one time a Whig, but later espoused the principles of the Republican party, with which he remained until his death. He became well known all over the county and passed his entire life in tilling the soil. To his marriage were born nine children, as follows: John S.; William, who died in 1849; Essel, died in 1876; Le Roy died in 1876; David died in 1849; Cynthia, deceased, was the wife of William Garnar; Polly was the wife of James Patten; Rebecca was the wife of James Wood, of Greene County, Mo., and Martha, who is the wife of Jackson Wood, of Douglas County. The father and mother of this family were consistent members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Their son, John S. Upshaw, was born in the State of Tennessee May 28, 1813, and there he received the principal part of his education. In the year 1833 he married Miss Jane Woods, a native of the same State and the daughter of Isaac Woods, who came to Greene County, Mo., at an early date. After marriage Mr. Upshaw and wife located first in Greene County, Mo., and cultivated the soil there until 1838 when they came to Douglas County. Two years later they settled on Fox Creek, where Mr. Upshaw still owns a farm and is half owner of a mill in company with his nephew, John Upshaw. His union with Miss Woods resulted in the birth of nine children, only one of whom lived to mature years. The others were Sarah, William, Oletha, Elizabeth, and five who died in infancy. Oletha grew to womanhood and married Zack Wells, but she is now deceased. Mr. Upshaw and wife are living at Upshaw and are well-known and representative citizens. Politically Mr. Upshaw supports the principles of the Republican party. During the war he was captain of Company C, Forty-sixth Regiment, Missouri Home Guards, and was in a number of battles. He and Mrs. Upshaw are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Mr. Upshaw is a self-made man and his principal occupation in life is farming and milling. The Upshaw family came to the State of Missouri in 1828 and to Douglas County in 1838, as before stated. They were the very best of citizens, being honest, industrious and progressive. Essel Upshaw was born on the 29th of April, 1838, and received his education in Missouri. After reaching mature years he married Miss Gussie McKey, daughter of John McKey, and later located in Greene County, where he remained for some time, when he came to this county locating on Fox Creek. There he farmed until his death in 1878. His children, eight in number, were named as follows: William, who died when small; John, the miller at Upshaw; Drury, who died in 1848; Frankley, a farmer and a resident of Upshaw; Henry, a farmer of Webster County; Benjamin, who is also a resident of Webster County; Sequel, farming in Webster County, and Patsey also living in Webster County. John Upshaw was born in Webster County, Mo., eighteen miles east of Springfield, October, 1841, and was the second son born to Essel Upshaw. He assisted his father on the farm in early life, attended the schools of Webster County, and when twenty-one years of age branched out to make his own way in life.

He married Miss Margaret Caldwell, daughter of James Caldwell, who came to Webster County, Mo., from Illinois in an early day, and there passed the remainder of his days. Mr. and Mrs. Upshaw settled on a farm in Webster County, where they remained until 1871, when he came to Upshaw, settling on Fox Creek, where he followed the arduous duties of a farmer. In 1890 he and his uncle built the roller mill at that place and he now resides on a farm near the mill. Eight children were the fruits of his marriage: William, John S., Henry, Elizabeth, Evaline, Martha, Frank and Edward. His wife died in 1874 and his second union was with Miss Frances Woolton, who has borne him five children: Sarah, Victoria, Ida, Sheldy and Early. In politics Mr. Upshaw is a staunch Republican, and as a citizen and neighbor stands deservedly high.
